Old Bones 15 Year is an elegant bourbon – a quintessential sipper. Imagine a late summer afternoon in the South, where the sun has gone under the horizon, and the heat of the day has subsided to a comfortable temperature. I picture rocking chairs and a creaky porch, and then this bourbon is what you are drinking with your favorite aunt or uncle. The conversation is deliberate and life affirming, and then you sip this whiskey in between listening and talking. You feel deeply satisfied but also hopeful. You don't want the day to end and you wish you had bought another bottle of Old Bone 15 yr.

Mash Bill Or Blend: 78.5% corn, 13% rye, 8.5% malted barley

Distillation: Frankfort, KY

Proof: 107 (barrel strength)

Current Batch: #2

Cases Produced: 215

Tasting Notes: Subtle hints of rose petals and ripe cherries on the nose. The cherry carries over intensely to the palate to provide a warm and satisfying sensation. This is a tremendously balanced and integrated whiskey that has nuanced richness and a surprisingly gentle alcohol under-structure for a barrel-strength bourbon. It's something that can only be created over time. There is a long and lingering finish that provides a perfect end to a special whiskey. Wow!

Old Bones 15 year old Reserve Straight (Batch 1), 53.5%

Distilled in Kentucky from a mashbill of 78% corn, 13% rye, and 9% malted barley, the nose showcases notes of orange peel, butterscotch, flan, and honey-roasted peanuts. The palate is tart and acidic; orange marmalade and lemon peel, with loads of nuts and spices. Even with water added, dried citrus peel and roasted nuts break through. The finish is mouthwatering, with tingling spice and rich oak. Well-balanced and flavorful with density and dimension. (1,290 bottles) - Reviewed by: Ted Simmons (Summer 2021)
